

# Required Summer Reading projects

## Entering 1st Grade

Students will read a book of their choosing. After reading the book, the student will complete a book report form. The form was sent home at the end of the school year and is posted on the school's website.

## Entering 2nd Grade

Students entering second grade will read a book of their choosing. After reading the book, students will complete the mini book report form. Students will need to write complete sentences describing the setting (where and when the story takes place), and the plot (beginning, middle, and end of the story). Students must use crayons for the pictures. The book report form is on the school's website.

## Entering Third Grade

Students entering Third Grade will read **Tornado** by Betsy Byars. After reading this book, students will complete the poster titled "My Book Report". The directions and poster were sent home at the end of the school year for all second grade students and are posted on our website. Write neatly and add colorful decorations to your poster. **These posters are due the first day of school.**

## Entering Fourth Grade

Students entering fourth grade will read **Frindle** by Andrew Clements this summer. A book jacket will be due the first day of school. The directions for the book jacket will be sent home at the end of the school year and posted on our website.

## Entering Fifth Grade

Students must read **The Tale of Despereaux** by Kate DiCamillo. They will complete a (lap) book report. Specific directions will be sent home at the end of the school year and posted on our website. Book reports are due on the first day of school.

**Rising 6<sup>th</sup> Graders:** Mandatory reading: Wonder by R.J. Palacio

**Rising 7<sup>th</sup> Graders:** Mandatory reading: The One and Only Ivan by Katherine Applegate

**Rising 8<sup>th</sup> Graders:** Mandatory reading: Rocket Boys by Homer H. Hickman, Jr.

- You are responsible to create a report for your book. The report will be placed in a folder and the front cover of the folder should contain a new cover for the book. Write the book title and author's name. At the bottom of the cover, write, "Cover designed by (your name)."
- You may choose to draw and color the cover or design it on your computer, print it out, and glue it to the front cover of your folder.
- The items below need to be placed inside the folder. More than one item may be on a single piece of paper. Label each section.

Please make sure you include the following items.

- **PLOT SUMMARY**- Must include a short plot summary with the introduction, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution labeled.
- **THEME**-It must have one paragraph about the theme. Remember a theme is the main subject in a piece of writing. You must be able to support your ideas with evidence from the text.
- **VOCABULARY WORDS**-It must have 10 vocabulary words that you do not know with the part of speech and definition of them listed.
- **AUTHOR**-It must have one paragraph of five to ten sentences about the author. Include when and where she/he was born, what other works she/he has written, and if she/he has received any significant awards.
- **TONE**- Include the tone-(overall mood)- In one paragraph of five to ten sentences, describe the overall tone of the book and explain.
- **SETTING**- Include details from the book about settings of the book.
- **MAIN CHARACTER**- - Have a paragraph about the main character. It needs to describe the character's appearance, how they express themselves/interact with the other characters

Rising 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Graders must also include the following:

**II. LITERARY DEVICES:** Using the glossary below, try to identify five examples of literary devices (simile, metaphor, personification) from within each novel. Rewrite the literary device examples you find, making sure to include novel title and page numbers. Label this section "Literary Devices."

**Simile:** A comparison of two different things, which uses the words LIKE or AS.

Example: She is like the wind. (Comparing a girl to the wind.) Example: He was as wise as an owl. (Comparing a boy to a bird often associated with wisdom.)

**Metaphor:** A comparison of two different things that do not use words like or as.

Examples: She is my rock. (The girl is being compared to the strength and stability of a rock. The girl is not actually a rock. However, the comparison is made to illustrate the girl's strength.) Example: Life is a highway. (Life is not really a highway. The comparison is being made to illustrate that life is a journey.)

**Personification:** Giving something that is NOT human, people-like qualities.

Example: The stars danced playfully in the inky sky. (Stars don't dance. People dance. The author used personification to make the stars seem as if they were alive.)




# Our Scrip Year Starts

## May 1, 2016 – April 30, 2017

Corpus Christi School uses a fundraising program known as “**SCRIP**” as its main fundraising activity. Scrip is a program that runs all year long (even in the summer) and requires no door-to-door sales by children or parents. Participation in the Scrip program costs our families nothing and we even share the profits back with you, our school families!

“Scrip” is simply gift certificates or debit cards. Our families order from the merchants listed on our order form and those vendors are listed with the Great Lakes Scrip Center. We then purchase the cards at a discounted price. The difference between the full price paid by the families and the discounted price paid by the school is profit for the school. Scrip certificates and debit cards are used just like cash at the merchants who offer them. Participating in the program ***COSTS YOU NO EXTRA MONEY!!*** You shop at the places you always shop, you simply purchase Scrip for that merchant before you go shopping.

Some examples of Scrip merchants are Wal-Mart, Target, Shell, Winn Dixie, Dillard’s, Land’s End, Lowes, Outback, Papa John’s Pizza, and over 300 other merchants. Great Lakes Scrip Center provides Scrip from over 300 merchants and Corpus Christi has recruited local merchants in addition to the national merchants. Our order form reflects the most popular merchants available to us in this area but Scrip can be ordered from any Great Lakes Scrip Center merchant listed on their web site.

Now to the “*profit-sharing*” part – After a Corpus Christi School family earns \$100 profit for the school; any further profit is split 50/50 between the school and the family in the form of a check. After the initial \$100 profit, one-half of all profit earned directly benefits your family! Many families recruit grandparents, aunts and uncles to purchase Scrip for their families, therefore reaching their \$100 goal sooner.

Scrip orders are processed every Monday morning at 11:00 during the school year and by 9am during the summer. Most parents send their orders in with their child on Monday morning and the teacher or assistant sends the orders to the Scrip office. Scrip orders may be dropped off at any time during the week at the Parish Office, the School office or the Preschool Office. These orders will be filled with inventory on hand, or processed the following Monday. Orders are filled on Wednesday and delivered to classrooms to be sent home to the parents unless other arrangements are made. **PARENTS ASSUME FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ORDERS LOST BY THEIR CHILD (REN)**. Scrip inventory may also be available for purchase at other times during the week. The Scrip office is unable to issue refunds on orders but will issue a credit if so needed. Occasionally, certificates are on backorder at the Great Lakes Scrip Center but they will be delivered as soon as received. If a family changes their mind about purchasing an item that is on backorder, a credit can be issued for a future Scrip order.
